



## TRANSPORTATION SAFETY

Alarm Systems! What's New in Safety:

the website listed below.

In accordance with Senate Bill 252.

specified providers are required as of Jan. 1, 2022, to install an alarm system in each vehicle used by the program to transport children. Florida Administrative Code 65C-20.008, 65C-22.001 and 65C-22.008, along with classification summaries and training courses now reflect the new legislation. 




