Benefits of Mixed-Age Groups for the Child

Developmentally Appropriate. The mixed-age group environment is a very normal and natural setting. The real world is full of people of all ages, just as in the child's family, neighborhood, and community. Although schools and many daycare centers choose to segregate children by ages, this does not reflect real life.

Provider Continuity. Children are not moved to a new classroom and new teacher when they have a birthday or master a certain skill. It is difficult for parents and children to frequently have to transfer feelings of trust, comfort and affection to another caregiver.

Individual Attention. Family child care providers are more accepting of uneven development. They are able to focus on each child as an individual rather than on just one child in a group of babies/children. Teachers of sameage groups may be more tempted to expect children to learn at the same pace.

Family/Sibling-Like Relationships. These relationships can be fostered, and are sources of trust, affection, comfort, and closeness. Research has shown that age is not an important factor for friendship choices.

Experience Different Roles. Each child has the opportunity to play various roles such as the youngest, middle, or oldest of the group, and therefore have exposure to different learning experiences.



Social Development Enhanced. Each child has the opportunity to interact with a variety of behavior and continuously practice cooperative work and play skills (sharing, taking turns, expressing feelings, being helpful to others, etc.).

Builds Leadership Skills and Self-Esteem. The older children have the opportunity to lead, instruct, assume responsibility, and nurture others. They also strengthen their own skills and knowledge already acquired through the process of tutoring others.

Learning from Other Children. The younger children are exposed to more complex play, advanced language, and educational activities by observing and imitating the older children. They often learn better from other children than from adults.

Therapeutic for "At Risk" Children. Children with difficulty following rules are encouraged to remind the younger ones of the rules and therefore often learn to obey and control their own behavior. Children with low self-esteem have the opportunity to refine their social skills and interact in a non-competitive way around the younger children.

Minimizes Competetive Pressures. Many children are at various learning levels and will have age-specific needs at different times. In mixed-age groups, they are not usually compared to their same-age peers and therefore will not usually feel the need to compete.

"Waiting Time" is Minimized. Many activities are open-ended or coordinated for all ages – with all children involved. The older children are usually able to be helpful and assist with holding the door open, hand washing, putting away toys, setting the table, etc.

Hurricane Season is officially underway, and the Department of Children and Families is encouraging you to be prepared. The season began June 1 and continues through November 30. All providers are encouraged to take the time to prepare their families and homes for the season. Additionally, now is a good time to review your program's emergency preparedness plan and ensure all necessary supplies are available.

When reviewing your plan, think about activities that occur before/after a storm. Below are some examples.

Before the Storm:

- Coordinate with your licensing counselor to ensure that your contact information is update to date
- Make sure child care personnel (substitutes and employees for Large Family Child Care Home) know your program's Emergency Preparedness policies and procedures
- Have a plan in place for communicating with parents/guardians
- Ensure you have hurricane supplies
- Secure buildings and any outdoor items that are not anchored down

After the Storm:

- Contact your licensing counselor within 24 hours to update them on the operational status of your program
- If your program is without power you may not operate, unless powered by an alternate power source, such as a generator, that is permanently installed and maintained in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations and comply with the Florida Building Code and the Florida Fire Prevention Code 69A-60, F.A.C. The alternate power source and fuel supply shall be located in an area that is not subject to flooding or damage from storm surge
- Childcare programs may re-open/remain open if there is no structural damage, the site has full electrical service, and the water and sewage/ septic tank are working properly
